


## Finding cases on a point of law using the Key Number System


The Key Number System identifies and indexes legal concepts, so you can find cases stating or applying a legal concept.

## Browsing for cases using the Key Number System

 Access the Key Number System by clicking Browse by Topic under the Key Number System on the homepage.




2. Select a Key Number to browse sub-topics and find cases, e.g., 28 Employment Law.






A list of sub-topics and their key numbers is displayed.
 Click a Key Number to view significant cases on the topic, e.g., Remuneration > When payable.



4. Click the case title to view the judgment.







## Searching for cases using the Key Number System

Use the title search bar to search for classifications relevant to your issue.

1. Enter your search term into the **Title Search** bar and click **Search**, e.g., **discrimination**.




- 2. A list of the relevant topics and key numbers will be displayed.
  - a. Select the tick boxes next to the key numbers relevant to your research issue.
  - b. Click View Cases.





- The cases relevant to the selected key numbers will be displayed.
   The number to the right of the key classification shows how many cases are listed.
- 4. To narrow your results, you can filter by key number, jurisdiction, or date.
  - a. Use the plus (+) symbols to expand and select the required jurisdiction.
  - b. Select from the last 6 months, 12 months, 3 years, or enter a specific date or date range.
