- The precedents are available in a number of different formats to suit you. Precedents and letters are available in Word format, or within Softdocs can be adapted or created with an electronic letterhead so all emailed correspondence carries your information.
- As the official publisher of ASIC forms, you also receive detailed form guides, information sheets and regulatory guidance documents to help you complete the form correctly.
- If you locate a form or precedent not currently housed on Westlaw AU, the Index provides an easy to find solution. The landing page allows you to copy and then paste the document ID directly into your system to quickly locate the document.

To Access Thomson Reuters Forms & Precedents Index

Step 1. Go to www.westlaw.com.au

Step 2. From the Westlaw AU login page enter a Username and Password and click Sign In, or IP Users click Sign In by IP Access.

Step 3. From the Westlaw AU homepage click **Thomson Reuters Forms and Precedents** option available in the search templates located in the left hand pane.

PUR46-- STATUTORY DECLARATION BY A BENEFICIARY BEING ONE OF THE PURCHASERS SUPPORTING THE TRUST DEED

[Before any contract is prepared or entered into, you must refer to Stamp Duty Ruling SD120 dated 29 November 1988 on resulting trusts.]

[The Certificate under Section 34(1)(c) of the Oaths Act 1900 has been added pursuant to the Oaths Regulation 2011 (NSW) which commenced on 30 April 2012. Its object is to set out the procedure in New South Wales for identifying persons making statutory declarations or affidavits. Statutory declarations should be prepared so that the jurat and certificate do not appear on a page by themselves. Ideally, the jurat and certificate should appear on a page where at least some of the text of the body of the statutory declaration appears.]
