HELD: CIL has not paid the amount due and has not pleaded the contract on which the determination was made was not a construction contract to which the CCA applied - no conditions were placed on CIL's obligation to pay - no basis to oppose entry of the amount owing as a judgment under s74 CCA - no substantial dispute entitling CIL to have the statutory demand set aside - no serious breach of natural justice in the determination - no bias - in any case s60 CCA applies and the determination remains binding notwithstanding an existing or threatened judicial review application - CIL has delayed and no actual judicial review application has yet been filed - application declined
