


### Searching and browsing books

This guide shows you how to search and browse books on Westlaw. Books are law textbooks available in edition format.


#### Searching books

1. Search the collection of **books** from in the **Secondary Sources** menu.

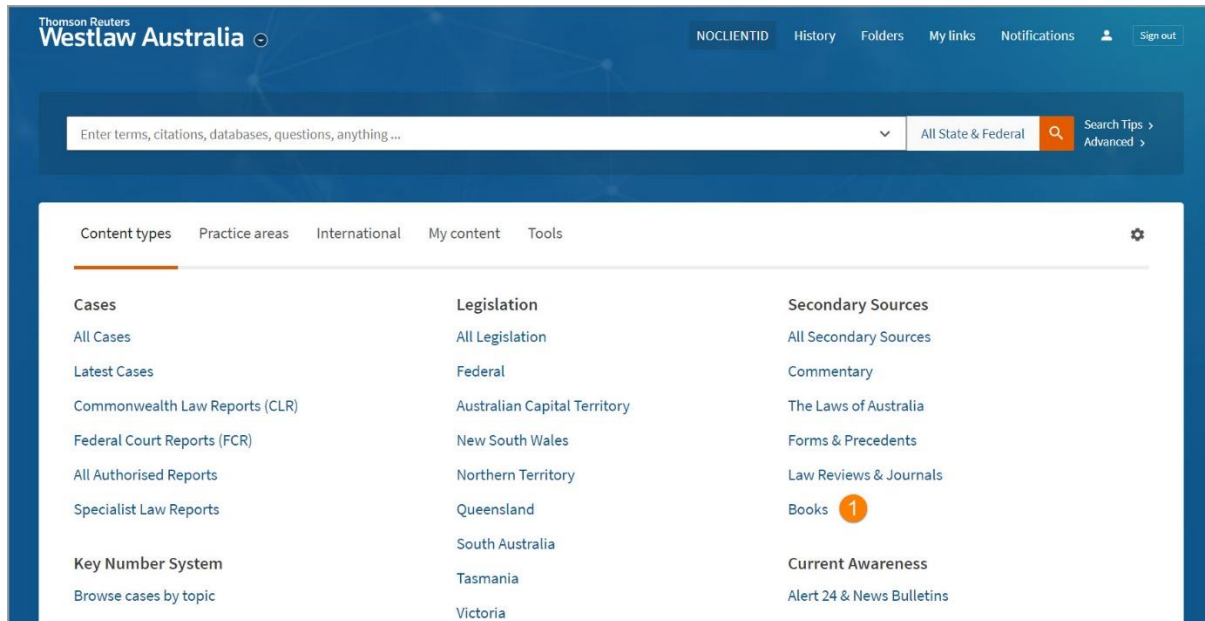

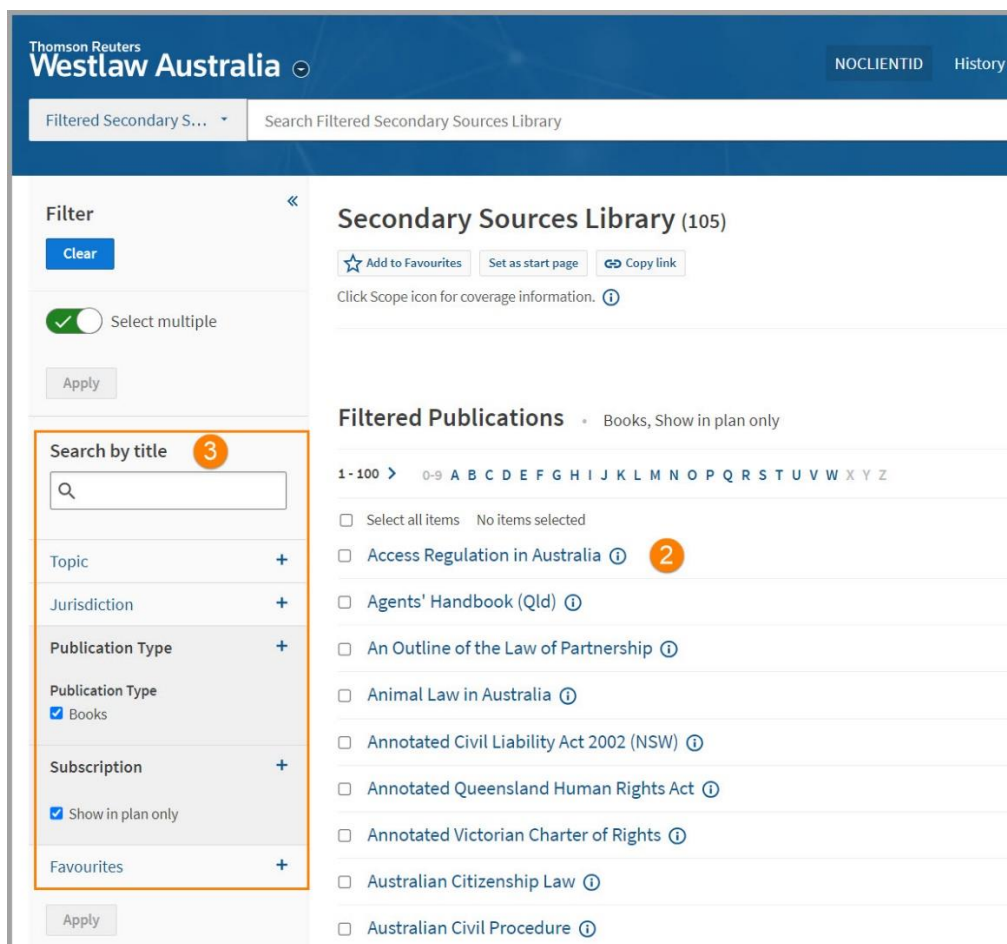

## Browsing books

- Browse the collection of **books** from in the **Secondary Sources** menu.



- Click on the book title to browse. Click the “i” icon to view more information about the book.
- Use the left-hand filter menu to refine books by topic, jurisdiction or use words in the title.

9. Once you are in a **Book**, click the **+ symbols** to open chapters.
10. Click on a heading to view the text.
11. You can also browse by using the **index** in the same way as using a hard copy book.
